General updates

- Met with William Gu, Lexy (ODUS), and Dean Dunne on 4/12 to discuss social possibilities for the end of the semester
- Met with VP Calhoun
- COCS meeting approved a proposal for an ASL program in linguistics, hiring of more faculty, and other measures that were included in the referenda relating to the linguistics program. Due to the overlap between the outcome of the COCS meeting and the referenda, the referenda will no longer be circulated on the ballot.
- Working with Ashwin Mahadevan and the Office of the Executive VP and USLC to help with the search for the next Director of Transportation and Parking
- Tigers in Town events were held this weekend.
- Elections will be held next week.

Questions from the Senate:

- Could registration numbers for Tigers in Town be expanded so that every student who wants to sign up for a slot can get one?
 - There is a cap of 1,000 students due to capacity issues of the local businesses providing goods and services for Tigers in Town.
- Is there a way to ensure that students are only signed up once for an event?
 - Yes, students are only permitted to have one registration for each event.
- Is there a way to expand the hours during which food for Tigers in Town is offered, so that students can get food at later hours?
 - There are discussions about increasing the hours that students can pick up food, especially during the period of May 5-8th.
- What is the feasibility of getting Tigers in Town to sponsor an event at Wawa?
 - Tigers in Town has had more success in working with smaller businesses due to the time it takes for larger businesses to approve Tigers in Town events.

New Business

- 1. USG x Housing: Free Move out Supplies- Sarah Lee (10 minutes)**
 - Spoke with Turquoise Brewington and Dean Fisher about the possibility of USG subsidizing move out supplies to ensure students have easy access to move out supplies.

- USG and Housing will be able to provide free move out supplies for all on campus and off campus students who are on the social contract from April 26th to May 15th in Dillon Gym.
- There will be measures to ensure that students are maintaining adequate social distancing in Dillon Gym.
- During the first five days of giving out move-out supplies, Senate members can sign up for 30 minute shifts to help organize supplies in Dillon.

Questions from the Senate:

- Is there a limit to the number of boxes that students can take?
 - No, there is not a limit, but it may change depending on the number of boxes after the first week.
- Will there be representatives from Housing who will be helping distribute boxes?
 - One representative from Campus Storage, employees at Dillon, and Senate members will be present to facilitate an orderly and socially distanced distribution.

2. Mental Health Task Force Statement- Allen Liu (15 minutes)
